

SHEATHING

WHO HAS?

The amount of space enclosed by a given shape. It is always expressed in square units (e.g. square feet).

AREA

WHO HAS?

Vertical structural support for a wall. Typically 2 x 4 or 2 x 6 lumber is used for this purpose.

STUD

WHO HAS?

A precisely specified quantity.

UNIT (OF MEASURE)

WHO HAS?

The structural parts of a house or other building.

FRAMING

WHO HAS?

A set of rules and regulations governing the methods of construction.

BUILDING CODES

WHO HAS?

Number or amount of a given thing.

QUANTITY

WHO HAS?

The amount of work produced by an appliance compared to the amount of energy consumed. Represented as a percentage.

ENERGY EFFICIENCY

WHO HAS?

Amount of area a given quantity of a product extends over.

COVERAGE

WHO HAS?

A structural material made of layers of wood glued together, usually with the grains of adjoining layers at right angles to each other. Manufactured and used in 4' x 8' sheets of different thicknesses.

PLYWOOD

WHO HAS?

The slope of a roof. Expressed as the distance of vertical rise over the distance of horizontal run.

ROOF PITCH

WHO HAS?

Material used to cover the surface of a building's frame. Typically plywood or oriented strand board are used for this purpose.
